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Lessons

Step 4: In the *Lessons* section of the Drug Court Curriculum, users can watch videos of expert presenters discussing a wide array of topics relevant to drug courts.

- 1. The *Lesson Overview* page gives the user an overview of the material to be presented including goals and objectives of the lesson, total length of the lesson and biographic information on the presenter.
- 2. The Lesson Overview page also includes a sidebar of the *Lesson Material*, with video run times of each sub-module of the course.
- 3. Modules can be watched individually and a *Lesson Progress Bar* shows the percentage of the overall course completion.
- 4. The Lesson Overview page also allows the user to download the PowerPoint presentation associated with the lesson by clicking on the text labeled <u>Click Here</u> at the bottom of the screen.
